Why did the United States initially not want to get involved, and why did it eventually join the effort? How did this affect the course of the war and the power of the United States</li> <li>3. Assess the political leadership of Woodrow Wilson in terms of foreign policy</li> <li>4. In what ways were the League fight and the Red Scare emblematic of the shift in American attitudes toward the world in the years following the Great War?</li> </ol>
